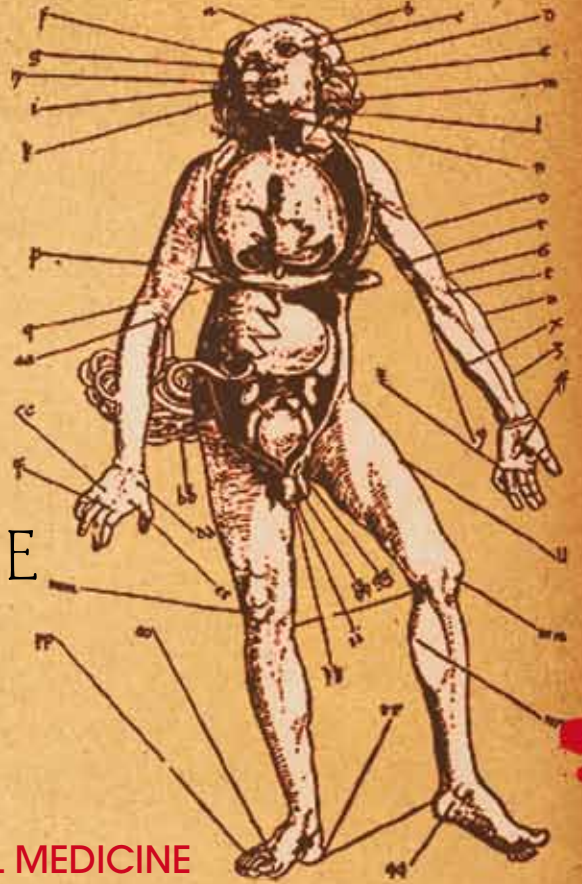

Find out what it was really like to be a patient in a medieval hospital through two interactive workshops led by Medieval Historians from the University of East Anglia. You will learn about grisly surgical techniques, such as bloodletting, cataract removal and extracting arrows from the head or a limb (all without anaesthetic), as well as the remedies people used to ward off and to cure ailments, using ingredients as diverse as gold, snails and animal dung!



You will also have a rare opportunity to be taken on a tour of The Great Hospital in Norwich, one of England's oldest hospitals.
